## APPENDIX I Permit Provisions

- 1. No closure or relocation of any Bastrop County or State of Texas roads is approved. No crossing other than at-grade, of any Bastrop County or State of Texas roads by primary or ancillary mine roads is approved. Alcoa shall provide documentation for approval of the closure, relocation, or crossing of any Bastrop County road or highway owned by the State of Texas, in accordance with 16 TEXAS ADMIN. CODE §§12.71 and 12.72, as delegated by the Commission to the respective public road authority. No closures, relocations or crossings (other than at-grade) shall be implemented prior to obtaining written approval from the Director of the Surface Mining and Reclamation Division, upon acceptance of adequate documentation of road authority approval.
- 2. Mining is prohibited in all proposed mine areas except in the A mine area located east of State Highway FM 619 labeled as Years 1, 2, and 3, as depicted on Plate 142-A2-Alt. Mining in other mine areas as proposed in either the preferred or alternate mine plan may occur after obtaining written approval from the Director of the Surface Mining and Reclamation Division, upon acceptance of adequate documentation of right of entry to Tracts T035 and T097 or road authority approval allowing equipment to access these other mine areas. Atgrade crossings of public roads by primary or ancillary mine roads are at the discretion of the road authority.
- 3. Bahiagrass; alfalfa; arrowleaf clover; bur clover, subterranean clover, and burseem clover; singletary and Austrian winterpea; vetch; lespedezas (common, Korean, and sericea); and cowpea are not approved reclamation species for postmine pastureland use. These species may be used for postmine pastureland reclamation after appropriate documentation has been provided by Alcoa that the introduced species are desirable and necessary to achieve postmine pastureland use and written approval is obtained from the Director of the Surface Mining and Reclamation Division.
- 4. Bermudagrass is not an approved reclamation species for fish and wildlife habitat and undeveloped land uses. This species may be used for postmine fish and wildlife habitat or undeveloped land reclamation after appropriate documentation has been provided by Alcoa that the introduced species is desirable and necessary to achieve the approved postmine land uses and written approval is obtained from the Director of the Surface Mining and Reclamation Division.
- 5. Alcoa must timely submit a copy of each site-specific Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and Notice of Intent (NOI) for any construction outside surface water control as required by the SWPPP. A copy of the NOI and the site-specific SWPPP must be available at any construction site as required by the SWPPP.
- 6. Postmine industrial/commercial land use for relocation of Bastrop County and State of Texas public roads is not approved. Alcoa shall provide documentation for approval of the closure and relocation of any Bastrop County Road or highway owned by the State of Texas, in accordance with 16 TEXAS ADMIN. CODE §§12.71 and 12.72, as delegated by the Commission to the respective public road authority. Postmine industrial/commercial land use for relocation of Bastrop County and State of Texas roads may not be implemented prior to obtaining written approval from the Director of the Surface Mining and Reclamation Division.
- 7. The postmine land use for Tract TO37 is the premine land use.
