**FINAL ORDER
GRANTING THE APPLICATION OF DOUBLE PLAY OIL & GAS, INC.
TO CONSIDER A MAXIMUM EFFICIENT RATE ALLOWABLE
AND TO CANCEL OVERPRODUCTION FOR THE
MCNEILL NORTHEAST LEASE, WELL NO. 1-C,
PAISANO CREEK (HOCKLEY) FIELD, LIVE OAK COUNTY, TEXAS**

The Commission finds that after statutory notice in the above-numbered docket heard on October 28, 2016 the Technical Examiner and Administrative Law Judge (collectively, "Examiners") have made and filed a report and recommendation containing findings of fact and conclusions of law, for which service was not required; that the proposed application complies with all statutory requirements; and that this proceeding was duly submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas at conference held in its offices in Austin, Texas.

The Commission, after review and due consideration of the Examiners' report and recommendation, the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, hereby adopts as its own the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and incorporates said findings of fact and conclusions of law as if fully set out and separately stated herein.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** by the Railroad Commission of Texas that the McNeill Northeast Lease (No. 02-09187), Well No. 1-C (API No. 42-297-34732), in the Paisano Creek (Hockley) Field, Live Oak County, Texas, may be produced under a maximum efficient rate allowable of 100 barrels of oil per day. It is further **ORDERED** that all accumulated overproduction on the McNeill Northeast Lease in the Paisano Creek (Hockley) Field is canceled.

It is further **ORDERED** by the Commission that this order shall not be final and effective until 25 days after the Commission's order is signed, unless the time for filing a motion for rehearing has been extended under Tex. Gov't Code §2001.142, by agreement under Tex. Gov't Code §2001.147, or by written Commission Order issued pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code §2001.146(e). If a timely motion for rehearing of an application is filed by any party at interest, this order shall not become final and effective until such motion is overruled, or if such motion is granted, this order shall be subject to further action by the Commission. Pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code §2001.146(e), the time allotted for Commission action on a motion for rehearing in this case prior to its being overruled by operation of law is hereby extended until 90 days from the date Commission Order is signed.
