FINAL ORDER

APPROVING THE APPLICATION OF SHELL WESTERN E&P FOR AN EXCEPTION TO 16 TAC §3.32 TO FLARE GAS FROM THE KING STALLION FACILITY, PHANTOM (WOLFCAMP) AND MOORE HOOPER (WOLFCAMP/PENN CONS) FIELDS, WARD COUNTY, TEXAS

The Commission finds that after statutory notice in the above-numerated docket heard on May 11, 2017, the presiding Examiners have made and filed a report and recommendation containing findings of fact and conclusions of law, for which service was not required; that the proposed application submitted by Shell Western E&P is in compliance with all statutory requirements; and that this proceeding was duly submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas at conference held in its offices in Austin, Texas.

The Commission, after review and due consideration of the examiners' report and recommendation, the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and any exceptions and replies thereto, hereby adopts as its own the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and incorporates said findings of fact and conclusions of law as if fully set out and separately stated herein.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** by the Railroad Commission of Texas that Shell Western E&P is hereby granted an exception to Statewide Rule 32 for the. Shell is authorized to flare gas from its King Stallion Facility at a rate of 65,000 Mcf per month (2,166 mcf/d) for two years from 04/10/2017 through 04/09/2019.

The authority is granted provided all production is reported on the appropriate Commission forms. Shell Western E&P shall simultaneously file the Statewide Rule 32 Exception Data Sheet, and the appropriate Commission required administrative Statewide Rule 32 Exception gas flaring fee.
