> 8.115 (a)(5): Do I interpret this correctly? Any new pipeline construction on a distribution system, less than 10 miles still requires notification? So, if I want to extend my gas main 200 feet to reach a new customer that called in last week and are converting, I need to tell them to wait 30 days while I wait to notify the Railroad Commission. Please tell me I read that wrong.

I think a matrix of some sort will help clarify which pipelines of which length require a notice and when.
