Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on the issue of whether the Railroad Commission of Texas should exercise its authority of curtailing statewide production to stabilize the oil and gas market.

This letter is to state my unequivocal support for prorationing and/or other state – mandated managed production cuts to deal with the impact of both geopolitical factors and reduced energy demand on the economy of the great state of Texas.

The United States is currently the largest oil producer in the world and Texas is the largest oil producing state, accounting for five million of the thirteen million barrels produced nationally each day.

During this time of unprecedented levels of challenge, the Railroad Commission of Texas should take lead to make this and other difficult decisions to stabilize the economy – other states will follow Texas' lead. Not only would such action have positive consequences for the oil and gas industry, employees, workforce, and state budget, but it could possibly reduce the fluctuation for those local and state governments that depend on oil for a substantial portion of their revenue.
