APPLICATION OF ROUNDROCK MIDSTREAM LLC (730112) PURSUANT TO STATEWIDE RULE 46 FOR A COMMERCIAL PERMIT TO INJECT FLUID INTO A RESERVOIR PRODUCTIVE OF OIL OR GAS FOR THE MUDHOLE LEASE, WELL NO. 1, CARTHAGE (TRAVIS PEAK) FIELD, PANOLA COUNTY, TEXAS

FINAL ORDER

The Railroad Commission ("RRC" or "Commission") finds that after statutory notice in the above-docketed case, heard on June 11-12, 2019, the presiding Technical Examiner and Administrative Law Judge have made and filed a Proposal for Decision containing findings of fact and conclusions of law, which was served on all parties of record, and that this proceeding was duly submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas at a conference held in its offices in Austin, Texas.

The Commission, after review and due consideration of the Proposal for Decision and the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and any exceptions and replies thereto, hereby adopts as its own the findings of fact and conclusions of law contained therein, and incorporates those findings of fact and conclusions of law as if fully set out and separately stated herein.

Roundrock Midstream, LLC (Operator No. 730112) ("Roundrock") filed an Application for a commercial permit to dispose of oil and gas waste by injection for the Mudhole Lease, Well No. 1, Carthage (Travis Peak) Field (Field No. 16032812), in Panola County, pursuant to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 3.46. It is **ORDERED** by the Railroad Commission of Texas that the Application of Roundrock pursuant to § 3.46, to dispose of non-hazardous oil and gas waste by injection into a reservoir productive of oil or gas is hereby **DENIED**.

It is further **ORDERED** by the Commission that this order shall not be final and effective until 25 days after the Commission's order is signed, unless the time for filing a motion for rehearing has been extended under Tex. Gov't Code § 2001.142, by agreement under Tex. Gov't Code § 2001.147, or by written Commission Order issued pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code § 2001.146(e). If a timely motion for rehearing of an application is filed by any party at interest, this order shall not become final and effective until such motion is overruled, or if such motion is granted, this order shall be subject to further action by the Commission. Pursuant to Tex. Gov't Code § 2001.146(e), the time allotted for Commission action on a motion for rehearing in this case prior to its being overruled by operation of law is hereby extended until 100 days from the date Commission Order is signed.

All requested findings of fact and conclusions of law which are not expressly adopted herein are denied.
